COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

Grace Church is located in Camby, IN. Camby is an unincorporated community that spans three county corners and offers the best of country-type living with proximity to several smaller cities and just twenty minutes from downtown Indianapolis. If wide open spaces are to your liking, Brown County State Park is just forty-five minutes south of Grace Church. Shopping, schools, parks, hospitals, and entertainment surround our area. The cost of living in Camby is almost 10% less than the national average.

Indianapolis is known as a sports capital and convention city. The NCAA headquarters are located downtown, with Indianapolis hosting annual college tournaments. The Colts, Pacers, Indians & Indy 11 provide year-round professional football, basketball, baseball, and soccer events. Not to mention, Indianapolis is home to the Indy 500 & festival annually in May. Indianapolis has all the amenities of a big city with a small-town feel. Getting around the greater Indianapolis area is easy with accessible interstate systems. Known as the Crossroads of America, you can take day trips to Cincinnati, Louisville, & St. Louis. Grace Church, located just fifteen minutes from Indianapolis International Airport, makes flying accessible.

CHURCH HISTORY

Grace Church began in 1950 in Mooresville, IN. Having a small group of committed followers of Jesus, they soon outgrew their building in Mooresville and moved just north to Camby in the mid-1960s. There, God continued to grow Grace, and through numerous building additions and renovations, the decision was made to purchase 5+ acres north and build the current building in 2006. In the last 34 years, Grace has had two Lead Pastors, with the current Lead Pastor in his 11th year.

WORSHIP STYLE OF YOUR CHURCH

Our worship style is modern, and we aim for an atmosphere that is engaging for both the seasoned Christian and the brand-new visitor. Our current rotation of songs includes music from Elevation, Hillsong, Vertical Worship, I AM THEY, and many others. We have a full band of musicians and most Sundays we feature a full band but love the creative freedom to do different things occasionally like acoustic or guest leader Sundays.

OVERVIEW OF WEEKLY WORSHIP GATHERING

We have two identical Sunday morning services at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m., featuring a modern worship style incorporating current worship music, lighting, video, and other creative elements. Pastor Marty's preaching style is relatable, understandable, spiritually challenging, and grounded in the Word of God. People often comment about the worship being engaging, the message being down to earth, and the service feeling very personable.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR FACILITY

We have just over five acres of property. Our current facility was built in 2006. It

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has 43,000 square feet and houses a six-hundred-seat Worship Center, a full-size gymnasium, a Café, several children's classrooms, a designated youth space with break-out rooms, and two adult classrooms. Our staff offices are also housed within the church. We also have a community walking trail on the premises.

We currently have a mortgage on the building, and by January 2024, it will be just under a balance due of \$2 million.

OTHER MINISTRY PARTNERSHIPS

We are part of the Missionary Church denomination. Organizationally, we are a denomination, but we really see ourselves as a family of churches. As a family of churches, we realize that we have a unique identity. Others may share in one or more of our traits, but we believe the combination of the following five traits (Core Values, Purpose, Roots, Beliefs, and Relationships) expresses this unique identity of the Missionary Church. While we do not have formal partnerships with other ministries/para-church organizations, we consider several local ministries Mission Partners. We either support them financially, through serving alongside them or sometimes both. These organizations include, but are not limited to, Clarity Pregnancy Centers, Churches in Mission, World Vision, Youth for Christ (Campus Life), and One Mission Society. We are also currently partnered with four international missionaries.

GOVERNANCE & POLITY

We are Board-governed and Staff-led. The Leadership Board, comprised of three elders, three deaconesses, and the Lead Pastor, serves to guard Grace Church's spiritual integrity and policy governance. All ministry falls under the purview of the staff. All day-to-day ministry and staffing decisions are run through the Executive Team, which comprises the Lead Pastor, the Executive Pastor, and the Worship Pastor, with the Lead Pastor being the ultimate decision-maker. The Leadership Board oversees employment matters involving any issue of morality.

MAJOR MINISTRIES OF THE CHURCH

Grace Kids (Birth – 6th grade): In Grace Kids, we want to win, build, and send Grace Kids for Jesus. We want every child from birth to sixth grade to not just know about Jesus but to know Him as their forever friend. Grace Kids Ministries offers weekly opportunities to learn about Jesus. Classes for school-age kids include a large group environment and small groups for discussion and connection. Fifth and Sixth-grade students are invited to join us every other Wednesday evening for The Edge. Special events such as Daycamp, Camp Blast, and many more are intentional environments created to help kids know Jesus more.

We believe that discipleship is crucial for all ages and stages, and therefore, we have created the following definitions and expectations for kids within the Grace Kids Ministry:

Nursery children (0-2 years of age will feel that: "God loves me" and "People at church love me" because of the way they are cared for by the Grace Kids Nursery Team and other adults at church.

Young Preschool (2-3 years old) can tell others that: "God loves people and is with them," "God sent Jesus because He loves us," and "God made everything."

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Older Preschool (4-5 years old) can tell others that: "God loves people no matter what," "He can do all things," "Jesus died on the cross and then came back to life," and "The stories in the Bible are true and really happened."

Young Elementary (K-2nd Grade) understands and can tell others that: "God is the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit," "He always has been and always will be," "Jesus understands what it's like to be human," "People who love Jesus want to obey Him," and "The church is more than a building; it is Christians who gather together to worship and serve God."

Middle Elementary (3rd - 4th Grade) understands and can tell others that: "God is everywhere at all times," "He knows what people need and desire, but still expects them to pray," "Jesus died to pay the penalty for all my sins - salvation is the beginning of a growing relationship with Jesus that lasts forever," and "God uses the church to meet the needs of people in the community and around the world.

Upper Elementary/Preteen (5th - 6th Grade) understands and can tell others that: "God wants people to communicate with Him and study the Bible daily," "A growing relationship with Jesus is important and necessary," "A Christian experiences joy when he recognizes God is working in his life and the lives of others," and "God calls all Christians to tell people about Jesus and to teach them how to know and follow God."

GSM (Grace Student Ministries: 7 – 12th Grades):

We currently have ninety-nine students on the roster but only have a consistent impact on thirty-five.

We believe that discipleship is crucial for all ages and stages, and therefore, we have created the following definitions and expectations for kids within the Grace Student Ministries:

Grace Student Ministries exists to help students KNOW Jesus personally, GROW in spiritual maturity, SHOW commitment to God's family, and GO make disciples through life on mission.

Know Jesus Personally: A disciple has put their faith and trust in Christ alone for salvation, entering into a personal relationship with God. Skill: Share their story of coming to faith in Christ.

Grow in Spiritual Maturity: A disciple is one who increasingly displays a life in which they think, speak, act, and relate to others in a Christlike manner.

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Skill: Develop a Time Alone With God (TAWG) outside of corporate worship, including Bible reading and prayer.

Show Commitment to God's Family: A disciple is committed to forging an authentic Christian community through faithful participation in body life (church, youth group, etc.) where they receive from others, serve with their gifts, and contribute with their finances.

Skill: Faithfully attends GSM with a heart open to others—sharing one's perspective and lovingly listening to others in small group discussions. Skill: Discovers and uses one's spiritual gifts to serve the body of believers.

Go Make Disciples Through A Life On Mission: A disciple regards no one from an earthly point of view but rather views and treats all relationships as opportunities to show and share the love of Christ.

Skill: Maintains a regular prayer concern for friends & family who do not know Christ.

Skill: Invites friends to participate in GSM activities and group times.

Skill: Participates in a mission trip during their GSM tenure.

We believe all students are loved by God, able to experience His power for daily living, and are called to a purpose bigger than themselves. Grace Student Ministries includes a large group environment, small groups for discussion and connection, special classes, conferences, fun outings, and mission trips. The launchpad for everything we do is on Sundays at 11 AM for middle school students and at 5 PM for high school students.

Young Adults: This area of ministry is lay-lead by a couple of our young adults. The need for this ministry is very small but is gaining momentum with about six current college students. We want to see this ministry area grow and expand to incorporate those aged eighteen to twenty-somethings, married and single.

Community Groups: Community Groups are integral to what we do at Grace Church. Discipleship happens when we are in a community, and community happens in circles, not rows. Community groups allow us to connect with others and grow our relationship with Jesus. Community Groups take shape at Grace in many ways, such as through Discipleship Groups, In-Home Groups (Small Groups), Man-Up Monday Events, Women's Bible Studies, Relate Strong, relengage, and many more).

Discipleship Groups (D-Groups): A D-Group is a gender-specific closed group of

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three to five believers (including the leader) who meet together weekly for the purpose of accelerated spiritual transformation. These groups challenge each person to get real about life and to help one another grow in love for God and out in obedience to God as disciple-makers. We rolled out this practical initiative in June of 2023. We are currently utilizing the six books in the DisciplesPath series by Lifeway. As a person completes the first three books, they are challenged to find a group of people to lead through the books in a new D-Group. Discipleship is about formation and multiplication. As of September 2023, we have about twenty-five adults and fifteen high school students involved in D-Groups.

In-Home Community Groups (Small Groups): A Small Group is an intentional gathering of people who meet regularly for the purpose of being developed as Christ's disciples. Groups are intended to help people learn how to love God with passion and faith, as they make Him the center of everything, and to love others as Christ loves us. Small Groups are a great way to get to know people and to have a small group of people who invest in your life while you invest in theirs. It's about finding a group of people who share your interests or a group who are entirely different to branch out and try something new. Whether you are looking for a group for just men, women, singles, college-aged young adults, married couples, young families, empty-nesters, or a mixture of the above, we have a group where you can belong.

Man-Up (Men's Ministry): The Men's Ministry has been active for several years, but in 2021, they launched Man-Up Monday. Following a semester-type schedule, men have been joining together to explore what it means to be the men designed them to be while being discipled and disciplining one another. There are currently thirty-three attending this session, but at least 67 men have completed at least one of the sessions, with many having attended all of them.

Women's Ministries: We seek to empower, strengthen, and encourage women to reach their full potential in God by helping women gain knowledge and understanding of God as they continually grow as disciples of Jesus. Women's Ministries includes Bible studies during the week and multiple events throughout the year, including opportunities for connection through fun events, conferences, and opportunities to serve. We have also hosted an IF: Local for the past three years.

Relate Strong: What if our relationships became what God intended them to be... a place where we grow in God's love and strength? RelateStrong (originally

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known as MarriageStrong) began in August 2008 at Fuller Theological Seminary with the mission of helping seminary students prepare their marriages for a life of leadership and service. Since then, RelateStrong has grown beyond the seminary setting and has been used in churches, Christian organizations, academic campuses, overseas programs, multicultural audiences, and other leadership venues. Grounded in theology and the best of psychology, RelateStrong is a framework that provides emotion regulation skills and other tools for healthy relating. Through identifying our particular pain points and ways of coping, we are able to find personal healing and form new, healthy patterns of relationship. Grace Church began offering RelateStrong in 2019. It is a 12-hour experience of discovery, growth, and freedom. It is a group experience combining teaching, reflection, and interaction. Relationships are challenging, and we all struggle. The Relate Strong experience offers tools to empower us by helping identify the unhealthy ways we have learned to cope, learning the truth of who God says we are, visualizing the new ways of interaction that bring healing and peace, and replacing hurtful environments with loving atmospheres of "us" and safety.

Re|Engage (Marriage Ministry): Re|engage is a ministry developed by Watermark Community Church in Dallas, Texas. The basic re|engage structure was created in 2008 out of Watermark's desire to serve all marriages in our community well. As stories of improved marriages spread, other churches began inquiring about re|engage, which led churches outside Watermark to offer re|engage starting in 2012. We began our pilot group of potential leaders in August of 2023 and are working to introduce this ministry church-wide in January 2024 and to the community as a whole in August 2024.

Re|engage brings couples together to learn about God's design for marriage and apply biblical principles for building a healthy relationship. Re|engage is for one-man, one-woman couples who are married (in other words, this is not for seriously dating, engaged, or cohabitating couples). There is both a small group and a large group element. Participants break off into smaller groups, each led by a facilitator couple. Together, the small group will work through the 14-lesson curriculum and learn how to effectively communicate, resolve conflict, and grow closer to your spouse. Then, everyone comes together for the large group setting, where they will hear biblical teaching on the topic for that week's homework and stories of hope from other couples whose marriages have been transformed.

Financial Peace University: Offered through Ramsey Solutions, Financial Peace University is a ministry that we offer to help people say goodbye to debt and

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begin learning how to manage their finances whether than their finances managing them. We believe that living in financial freedom as good stewards of what God has provided to us opens incredible opportunities for financial generosity that can leave a spiritual legacy beyond anything we can even imagine.

BUX: (Bethel University Extension Studies) Bethel University and Grace Church are partners in bringing an affordable, practical, and flexible Christian college option to Camby, Mooresville, and the surrounding areas. The Bethel Extension model (BU-X) allows students to stay in their communities while earning two-year or four-year degrees at an affordable rate. Financial aid is available for qualifying students. Classes are a mix of online and in-person formats and take place under the supervision of a church-hired site director, so students feel supported and encouraged. BU's mission is to transform communities through Christ-centered graduates. Every course is integrated with a biblical worldview. Students participate in weekly small group and mentoring activities.

Care Ministries: We have an incredible team of volunteers who are pivotal in this ministry area. The purpose of the Care Ministry is to ensure that all those within the congregation are cared for in the event of a physical, emotional, or spiritual crisis in their life that may require additional care than what the pastoral staff can feasibly provide. This is seen in the need for meals after surgeries, births of babies, the death of a loved one, or to alleviate a stressful need. They also provide care and encouragement through prayer, visits, phone calls, and cards.

Missions Ministry: We have a lay team of five individuals who have a passion for mission work and will be working alongside our Care and Mission Pastor to ensure that we are engaged not only financially with local and global missions but are also charged with navigating the tangible ways we can join these Mission Partners.

Worship Ministry: Our Tech Team, Vocal Teams, Instrumental Teams, and Stage Teams are all engaged in relationship-building with one another. There is an element of intentional discipleship with our Worship Pastor on each team level.

OUTREACH PROGRAMS OVERVIEW

- We launched multiple D-Groups.
- We have made a full recovery from Covid, both in attendance and giving. We have remained in the black in weekly giving based on necessary giving to meet the annual budget for 2023 thus far.
- We completed a Clarification of our Values and have worked to ensure that all we do is through that lens.
- We have watched God develop Grace into a consistent environment of praise, joy, and unity.
- We have launched a pilot group for Relengage (Marriage Ministry) after seeking God's guidance for three years.
- Thirteen men from our thriving Men's Ministry attended Man Camp this fall in Michigan.

BIGGEST OPPORTUNITY FOR YOUR CHURCH IN THE NEXT 12 MONTHS

- The biggest opportunity is working toward the debt elimination of the mortgage.
- Our next biggest opportunity is the continued involvement in disciple-making through connecting new people into community groups at Grace and seeking ways to enhance what is already being done as we continue to pray for revival in our community.

WHAT THEOLOGICAL HILLS WILL YOU DIE ON?

A candidate must meet Missionary Church requirements for licensure with a theological alignment that adheres to the positions outlined above. Nonnegotiables for us would include possessing convictions contrary to Faith through Christ alone, in the Inerrant Word of God, the command for Relational Disciple Making. There must also be an affirmation of women in ministry, including licensure and ordination. However, per our denomination, women are not candidates for a senior pastor position, but we can see a time when that may change.

HOT-BUTTON SOCIAL/CULTURAL ISSUES FOR YOUR CHURCH

A candidate must hold to marriage as between one man and one woman. We have compassion for LGBTQIA+ individuals, and all are welcome at Grace, but we do not affirm their lifestyle and choices. Per our convictions and denomination, we are forbidden from performing weddings for same-sex couples.

Regarding alcohol, we defer to the scripture of being a person above reproach and not being drunk.

DESCRIBE YOUR CHURCH'S POLICIES ON PARTICIPATION OF LGBTQ INDIVIDUALS IN THE LIFE OF YOUR CHURCH

We have compassion for LGBTQIA+ individuals, and all are welcome at Grace, but we do not affirm their lifestyle and choices. Therefore, as we would for anyone intentionally living in sin, these individuals are not eligible to serve in any capacity that would exercise spiritual authority over anyone else.

OVERALL DESCRIPTION OF THIS POSITION

We are seeking a full-time Student Ministries Pastor who is passionate about Jesus, His Church, and helping the next generation navigate their lives, doubts, and relationship with Jesus. Grace Student Ministry is a high priority in our church, as students are not only the most spiritually responsive segment of our society but are generally the most successful in winning and discipling their peers for Christ. Therefore, this strategic ministry must balance outreach, growth, and ministry opportunities for students.

GOALS AND EXPECTATIONS

Within the first year, we would see this individual build relationships with the existing middle school and high school students and volunteer staff, and there would be a leadership team established to give guidance on the ministry. A vision for the future would be developed and communicated, including disciple-making, outreach, and leader development in students and volunteers.

Beyond the first year, we would like to see the roster of students involved double, with those being active increasing significantly.

DO YOU HAVE A JOB DESCRIPTION FOR THIS ROLE?

Summary:

The position of Student Ministries Pastor for Grace Church plays a vital leadership role in the daily operations of our ministry. This individual will lead 7th through 12th grade ministries, with the primary goal being to lead students into fully devoted followers of Jesus. They will encourage and equip students to live out their faith at home and in other areas of influence and connect in the community with other students. The incumbent will seek to use their personal gifts for the benefit of the church by contributing to the overall leadership and

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influence of this particular department.

Oualifications:

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. This individual must love God and people and have a vital, growing relationship with Jesus Christ. The ideal candidate will possess leadership ability to set strategy, budget and tactical execution of department's plans and programs. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Spiritual Health:

This individual must maintain a passionate and growing relationship with God that is expressed through one's own personal and corporate worship experience. He or she exhibits a heart of compassion, dependability/responsibility, and is a servant leader. This individual is actively involved in disciple-making relationships. This individual also has a healthy balance between ministry and family life. They will foster an environment of mutual respect and accountability. He or she will also strive to work effectively with others in problem solving and issue resolution according to the parameters set before us in Matthew 18. The individual will live a life above reproach.
